
Process

5. INSTRUCT participants to arrange themselves in teams of three to five people they do not know.



6. PRESENT

- Learning the strengths and abilities of team members and peers can help you achieve your goals.
- When you fill a role based on a person's strengths and abilities, you boost morale, raise engagement and enhance the team member's skills.
- 7. SHOW the Questions slide.



Questions

- What traits do you and your team members have in common?
 - (Avoid listing superficial traits, such as hair color or height.)
- What are two unique traits of each team member, including you?

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- 8. INSTRUCT teams to spend 15 minutes discussing and taking notes on the following questions:
 - What traits do you have in common with your team members?
 - What are two unique traits of each team member, including you?



9. TIME 15 minutes.



10. SHOW the Results slide.



11. INSTRUCT a spokesperson from each team to read their list of shared traits to the entire group.


12. PRESENT
